Points are totaled at the conclusion of the rose show. Be sure your tag is marked “**N**” if you are a Novice.

ROSE SHOW RULES

1. This show is organized and judged in accordance with the rules of the American Rose Society. This is an alphabetical show; horticulture entries in Specimen Horticulture Classes (Division I, Section B) will be made in alphabetical order with the first letter of the rose name determining placement in each class unless otherwise specified in this schedule.
2. Only Golden Gate Rose Society members may take possession of Perpetual Trophies. Multiple blue, red and yellow ribbons or ‘dots’ may be given, but only one “best” entry will be chosen in each class or subclass where the entries merit them. Judges may withhold any of these awards at their discretion. The decisions of the Judges are final.
3. The Show Chair will be responsible for interpreting the show schedule and enforcing the rules of the show.

All Exhibitors

4. No exhibitor will be allowed to remain on the show floor when judging begins except those with specific assigned duties.
5. Anyone is eligible to enter this show as long as the exhibitor grows the roses in their own private garden, except where stated in certain Arrangement Classes. All Horticulture entries become the property of the Golden Gate Rose Society and are subject to sale to the public.
6. In all Horticulture Classes one person per garden is considered an exhibitor; two or more persons tending the same garden are considered an exhibiting team. Judges of this show may enter the Judges Class as individuals. Arrangements are considered an individual effort and each

member of an exhibiting team may enter their own creations.

7. Novices are urged to exhibit in all Divisions. A Novice is a person who has not won the Sweepstakes Award at our Monthly Shows or more than two blue ribbons at any ARS-accredited Annual Show. Write **N** on your entry tag under "Section." Credit for sweepstakes points will be withheld if this designation does not appear in the left upper corner of the top portion and the left upper corner of the lower portion of the entry tag.
8. Entry tags must be complete; **both the top and the bottom of the tag must be filled out.** You must name each variety of rose used except as noted in this schedule. Tags must be folded so that the name of the exhibitor cannot be seen. Official ARS entry tags must be used. Small tags for Miniature and Mini-Flora entries, large tags for Horticulture entries, Challenge tags for challenge classes and Arrangement (red) tags for arrangement entries.
9. No exhibits, entry tags, containers or awards may be removed before the close of the show except by the Show Committee.

Horticulture Exhibits

10. Only one entry per variety is allowed in Specimen classes but there is no limit to the number of different varieties you may enter. Only one entry per class is allowed in Judges and Challenge classes.
11. Containers will be furnished for all Challenge, Horticulture and Judges classes unless otherwise specified.
12. Wedges are permitted but must not protrude above the lip of the vase. A protruding wedge will be severely penalized.

13. Roses shown in one bloom per stem classes **MUST** be disbudded. These Classes include Hybrid Teas, Grandifloras, Floribundas, Climbers, Miniatures, Mini-Floras, and their climbing forms.
14. Sprays of Hybrid Teas, Grandifloras, Floribundas, Polyanthas, Climbers, Miniatures, Mini-Floras and their climbing forms must be shown with two or more blooms per stem. A bud is NOT considered a bloom.
15. Shrubs and Old Garden Roses may be shown as sprays or as one bloom per stem, whichever makes the better exhibit. They are also allowed to have ONE stem on stem condition (one year's growth only), and they can have side buds.

Rose Arrangements

16. Only one entry per class is allowed.
17. Use of artificial flowers, fruit or foliage, or living creatures, or the U.S. flag is not permitted. No painted or treated fresh plant material may be used.
18. Accessories are permitted unless otherwise specified. All containers will be provided by the exhibitor and remain the property of the exhibitor. GGRS assumes no responsibility for lost or stolen property.
19. Roses must be the dominant flower in all arrangements, correctly named and garden-grown.
20. "**AG**" must be noted on the entry tag if you are competing in the Arranger Grown classes. "**N**" must be printed on the entry tag if you are competing as a Novice. Novices may enter any class except Judges Classes.

Judging

21. Rose types and exhibition names will be determined by *Modern Roses 12* and its internet data base and supplements, the *American Rose Magazine*, up through the December issue of the year before the Show, *The American Rose Annual*, the *ARS Handbook for Selecting Roses*, the *ARS Handbook of Approved Exhibition Names*, the List of Recently Registered Roses on the ARS web site, and *The Combined Rose List*. Details, especially of Old Garden Roses prior to 1867, should be double-checked in *Modern Roses 12*.
22. Specimens will be judged in accordance with the ARS *Rules and Guidelines for Judging Roses*. Arrangements will be judged in accordance with the newest ARS *Guidelines for Judging Rose Arrangements*.
23. Horticulture entries will be disqualified for:
 - a. Entry misnamed, misclassified, misplaced, unlabeled or mislabeled on the entry tag (always double-check *Modern Roses 12* or the ARS *Handbook of Approved Exhibition Names*).
 - b. Exhibitor's name showing on the entry tag.
 - c. Stem on stem condition (except Old Garden Roses and Shrubs - see Rule #15).
 - d. Any foreign substance applied to the stem, foliage or bloom to improve the appearance of the entry.
 - e. Side buds not removed on a one bloom per stem entry (except Old Garden Roses and Shrubs - see Rule #15).
 - f. Any violation of ARS rules or the rules of the local society as set down in this schedule.

SECTION A CHALLENGE CLASSES

All varieties must be identified on the entry tag. Containers are furnished by GGRS unless otherwise specified.

Class 1 **Most Fragrant Rose** - One stem entry, one bloom per stem, any type of rose. GGRS Certificate

Class 2 **Large English Box** - Hybrid Tea/Grandiflora roses. Exhibition stage. One or more varieties. No stem or leaves visible. Box provided by exhibitor.

Class 3 **Small English Box** - Miniature/Mini-Flora roses. Exhibition stage. One or more varieties. No stem or leaves visible. Box provided by exhibitor.

- Class 4 **Rose in a Frame** - One bloom per stem, any large-flowered variety (not Mini/Polyantha/Mini-Flora) exhibited in an orchid tube attached to a dark background in a picture frame provided by GGRS. No foliage.
- Class 5 **Boutonniere** - One bloom without foliage, not a bud but at pre-exhibition stage, (petals unfurling but not yet an exhibition bloom). Bloom must be in proportion to size of lapel board container. Lapel boards provided by GGRS.
- Class 6 **Large Exhibition Floating Rose** - Hybrid Tea/Grandiflora/Floribunda/Shrub/Climber. Entry must float in a colorless container of clear water. Bloom exhibited without foliage and must be in proportion to size of container. HT exhibition form. Bowl provided by exhibitor.
- Class 7 **Decorative Floating Rose** - Shrub/Floribunda/Climber/OGR. Entry must float in a colorless container of clear water. Bloom exhibited without foliage and must be in proportion to size of container. Decorative form, NOT exhibition form, NOT fully open. Bowl provided by exhibitor.
- Class 8 **Small Exhibition Floating Rose** - Miniature/Mini-Flora. Entry must float in a colorless container of clear water. Bloom exhibited without foliage and must be in proportion to size of container. Exhibition form. Bowl provided by exhibitor.
- Class 9 **Large Stages of Bloom** - Three stems, disbudded, same variety, large roses (not miniatures, mini-floras or polyanthas). One bloom fully open with stamens showing, one bloom at exhibition stage, one bloom still an opening bud with sepals down and petals beginning to unfurl. One container. GGRS Certificate.
- Class 10 **Small Stages of Bloom** - Three stems, disbudded, same variety, small roses (miniatures, mini-floras or polyanthas). One bloom fully open with stamens showing, one bloom at exhibition stage, one bloom still an opening bud with sepals down and petals beginning to unfurl. One container. GGRS Certificate.
- Class 11 **Trailing Rose** - One spray of a rose (any variety). Exhibited in a floral tube, lying on a dinner napkin or velvet cloth of appropriate size. Tube to be concealed by the dinner napkin or cloth, lying on the table. Cloth and tube provided by exhibitor. Roses that bloom in linear sprays are ideal. GGRS Certificate.
- Class 12 **Hi-Lo Roses** - Two matched exhibition blooms, one a Hybrid Tea, Grandiflora or Floribunda, one a Miniature or Mini-Flora. Exhibited in separate vases with entry tags.
- Class 13 **Mini Rose Bouquet** - a bouquet of 5 or more blooms, at least 5 stems, miniature and/or mini-flora roses, in one clear container provided by the exhibitor.
- Class 14 **AARS Rose** - any AARS winner of the past 15 years (1994 - 2008). Year of Award must be on the entry tag. One bloom per stem or spray.
- Class 15 **Potted Rose** - a miniature, mini-flora or polyantha in a pot of 12" or less in diameter.
- Class 16 **Golden Gate Roses** - Celebrating Golden Gate Rose Society. Three (3) Medium or Deep Yellow blooms, all same variety, any type of rose, one bloom per stem, one container.
- Class 17 **Leap Year Roses** - Every four years the world allows time to catch up and this year it was called Leap Year 2008. One stem, any variety of a rose with a name that

refers to any of the ‘leap facts’ on our cover or has ‘year’, ‘leap’, ‘day’, ‘time’ or ‘jump’ in its name.

HYBRID TEAS, GRANDIFLORAS, AND THEIR CLIMBING FORMS

- Class 100 **One bloom per stem**, disbudded. One stem, exhibition form. Cultivars with 4 to 8 petals (singles) not eligible.
- Class 101 **Three stems of Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora**, one bloom per stem, disbudded. Same variety, exhibition form. Cultivars with 4 to 8 petals (singles) not eligible. One container.
- Class 102 **Hybrid Tea spray**, one stem, two or more exhibition blooms on the stem.

- Class 103 **Grandiflora spray**, one stem, two or more exhibition blooms on the stem.
- Class 104 **Three Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora sprays**, two or more exhibition blooms on each stem. One container.
- Class 105 **Single Hybrid Tea**, one bloom per stem, may be shown with side buds. (A single rose has 4 to 8 petals.)
- Class 106 **Fully open Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora** bloom (stamens showing), one entry per garden.

FLORIBUNDAS AND THEIR CLIMBING FORMS

- Class 200 **One bloom per stem**, disbudded.
- Class 201 **One stem spray**, two or more blooms on the stem. Form typical of the variety.
- Class 202 **Three sprays**, same variety or mixed, in one container.

POLYANTHAS

- Class 300 **One stem**. Naturally grown spray, two or more blooms on the stem.

MINIATURE ROSES AND THEIR CLIMBING FORMS

- Class 400 **One bloom per stem**, Miniature, exhibition form, no side buds. Cultivars with 4 to 8 petals (singles) not eligible.
- Class 401 **One stem spray**, Miniature, exhibition form, 2 or more blooms on the stem. Cultivars with 4 to 8 petals (singles) not eligible.

Class 402 **Single, one bloom per stem.** A single rose has 4 to 8 petals.

Class 403 **Single, one stem spray.** Two or more blooms on the stem. A single rose has 4 to 8 petals.

Class 404 **Fully open Miniature** bloom (stamens showing), one entry per garden.

MINI-FLORA ROSES AND THEIR CLIMBING FORMS

Class 450 **One bloom per stem,** Mini-Flora, exhibition form, no side buds. Cultivars with 4 to 8 petals (singles) not eligible.

Class 451 **One stem spray,** Mini-Flora, exhibition form, 2 or more blooms on the stem. Cultivars with 4 to 8 petals (singles) not eligible.

Class 452 **Fully open Mini-Flora** bloom (stamens showing), one entry per garden.

LARGE-FLOWERED CLIMBERS (LCI, Hybrid Wichurana, Hybrid Gigantea)

Naturally grown spray or one bloom per stem, whichever makes the better exhibit.

Class 500 **One stem.**

Class 501 **Three stems,** same or different varieties.

SHRUBS

Naturally grown spray or one bloom per stem, whichever makes the better exhibit. May be exhibited stem-on-stem (one year's growth).

Class 600 **Classic Shrubs** - One stem, only Hybrid Kordeesii, Hybrid Moyesii, Hybrid Musk, Hybrid Rugosa.

Class 601 **Modern Shrubs** - One stem, all Modern Shrubs including Austins.

Class 602 **Shrubs - three stems,** any varieties, modern or classic or mixed.

OLD GARDEN ROSES

Old Garden Roses are classes of roses established prior to the introduction date of the Hybrid Tea **La France** in 1867. At least one cultivar in each class dates to before 1867. The cultivars themselves are of mixed or unknown dates. There are two sections. See the *Handbook for Selecting Roses* or *Modern Roses 12* for detailed information. Stage all varieties in alphabetical order, regardless of family.

CULTIVARS INTRODUCED BEFORE 1867

Class 700 **One stem** (one bloom or one spray). Species cultivars not eligible.

CULTIVARS INTRODUCED 1867 & AFTER

Class 800 **One stem** (one bloom or one spray). Species cultivars not eligible.

SPECIES ROSES

(Marked “Sp” in the *Handbook for Selecting Roses*)

Class 900 **Species rose**, one bloom per stem or one spray.

NOVICE CLASSES

Novices Only Blue ribbon winners of these classes are also eligible for awards noted in other parts of this schedule. Entry tag must be marked with “N”.

Class N-1 **Hybrid Tea/Grandiflora. One bloom per stem**, exhibition form, grown disbudded. Cultivars with 4 to 8 petals (singles) not eligible.

Class N-2 **One Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora spray**, two or more exhibition blooms on one stem.

Class N-3 **Floribunda. One bloom per stem**, exhibition form, disbudded. Cultivars with 4 to 8 petals (singles) not eligible.

Class N-4 **Floribunda spray**, 2 or more blooms on the stem. Cultivars with 4 to 8 petals (singles) not eligible.

Class N-5 **Miniature or Mini-Flora. One bloom per stem**, exhibition form, disbudded. Cultivars with 4 to 8 petals (singles) not eligible.

Class N-6 **Miniature or Mini-Flora, one stem spray**, 2 or more blooms on the stem. Cultivars with 4 to 8 petals (singles) not eligible.

Class N-7 **Large-flowered Climbers**. Spray or one bloom per stem, whichever makes the better exhibit.

Class N-8 **Shrubs**. Spray or one bloom per stem, whichever makes the better exhibit.

Class N-9 **Old Garden Rose**. Spray or one bloom per stem, whichever makes the better exhibit.

JUDGES INVITATIONAL CLASS

Judges of this show are allowed one entry in each Class.

Class J-1 **Hybrid Tea/Grandiflora**. One bloom per stem, disbudded, exhibition form.

Class J-2 **Shrub/Climber**. One bloom per stem, disbudded, or spray

Class J-3 **Floribunda** One stem spray.

Class J-4 **Miniature / Mini-Flora** One bloom per stem, disbudded, exhibition form.

Class J-5 **OGR** One stem, spray or one bloom per stem.

ARS Medal Certificates (Gold, Silver and Bronze) are only given to the best entries that are marked “AG” for Arranger-Grown roses and score above **92** points.

A winning entry must score at least **90** points to win a first place ribbon. Second place entries must score at least **85** points, third place should score at least **80** points.

30" of table space will be available to each entry unless otherwise noted in class descriptions.

SECTION A

MINIATURE ROSE ARRANGEMENTS

All roses **MUST** be ‘Arranger-Grown.’ Mark AG on the entry tag. Best of Miniature Rose Arrangements is eligible for the ARS Mini Gold, Silver, and Bronze Certificates.

Class 1 “*Leap Year Baby*” A miniature design, no more than 10 inches in height, width, depth, miniature roses only. Arranger’s choice of design style.

Best entry of Class 1 also eligible for ARS Mini Royalty Award, Mini-Oriental Rosette or Mini Artist awards, depending on design.

SECTION B

MINI-FLORA ROSE ARRANGEMENTS

All roses **MUST** be ‘Arranger-Grown.’ Mark AG on the entry tag. Best entry is eligible for the ARS Best Mini-Flora Arrangement Award.

Class 2 “*What a Difference a Day Makes*” A modern line mass design, not to exceed 10 inches in height, width, depth, using mini-flora roses.

SECTION C

STANDARD ROSE ARRANGEMENTS

All roses **MUST** be ‘Arranger-Grown.’ Mark AG on the entry tag. Best of Standard Rose Arrangements is eligible for the ARS Gold, Silver, and Bronze Certificates.

Traditional

Class 3 “*Sadie Hawkins Day*” A line or line mass design.

Best of Class 3 also eligible for ARS Royalty Award.

Modern

Class 4 “*Marry Me!*” A parallel design.

Best of Class 4 eligible for ARS Artist Award.

Class 5 “*Younger Than You Think*” A design with an oriental flair, arranger’s choice of style.

Best of Class 5 eligible for ARS Oriental Rosette.

SECTION D

JUDGE’S SPECIAL CLASS

Class 6 “*24 Extra Hours*” A design with miniature or mini-flora roses. Arranger’s choice. No more than 10 inches in height, width, depth.

Class 7 “*Gimme a Little More*” Standard arrangement, arranger’s choice of design. Indicate type of design on entry tag.

Best of Class 6 and 7 eligible for ARS Best Judges’ certificate.
